PLYMOUTH READS GOING FORWARD

We had one incredibly successful event-over 100 kids making paper kites that were displayed in the library foyer. All other scheduled events had to be cancelled. Any of you who visited the library during those open days in early March got to see the gorgeous kite displays from Dave Herzig, aka the Kite Man.

All is not lost. Our main, most important event, the visit from Leif Enger, will happen later this fall or winter. We are hoping to present some of the other cancelled events as well.

From the Plymouth Library Staff:

We are proud to have found a way to connect with our library community during these unprecedented times. The Plymouth Library is currently operating with six staff, who are working hard to gather materials and bring them to the curbside pickup so patrons can continue their access to the library collection while the building is closed.

Starting May 11, delivery service was extended to gather materials from the seven other libraries with curbside service, which will hopefully help get patrons' requests filled as soon as possible.

For now we will remain in this holding pattern, taking calculated steps forwards as appropriate. Additional library staff have been working remotely with Hennepin County Library teams to innovate library services for the near and far future.

On the horizon: four to six other locations offering some type of additional library services once they are safety is guaranteed, the potential of taking returns once it is safe to do so, and welcoming the new director for our library system, Chad Helton, who officially starts August 24, 2020.
