Author Brooke Barker Visits Plymouth Library

Author Brooke Barker charmed an enthusiastic audience at the Plymouth Library in early December with her entertaining stories and drawings about her interactions with blue jays, crows, and other birds and animals. Barker's latest book, How Do Meerkats Order Pizza? describes the connection between scientists and facts about the animals they study. Her book is illustrated with engaging sketches of white-tailed deer, roosters, jaguars, humpback whales, and other animals who seem to be as interested in the scientists' research as humans are. Brooke's appearance was sponsored by the Friends of the Plymouth Library. Brooke's previous books include Sad Animal Facts and Sad Animal Babies. This was her second visit to the Plymouth Library and each time has been a delight, very informative and entertaining.
