This was the eighth garden tour sponsored by the Friends, and it netted \$1714. All proceeds from the tour will benefit the community through programs sponsored by the Library.

Visitors to the gardens were greeted by some nice surprises this year. A harpist provided live music by which to tour one garden, and another host gave away more than 50 garden pots. At another garden, visitors were able to admire a huge oak tree that, according to an arborist from the University of Minnesota, had "been a sapling when Columbus discovered America!" And garden hosts all received lovely handmade cards from one of the visitors.

Donna Cannon: A Life of Advocacy Continues Through Plymouth Reads

Donna Cannon has been a member of both the Plymouth Reads Bookclub and the Plymouth Reads Planning Committee, giving special attention to improving access for seniors, for more than five years. She was born and raised in Minnesota. Her education includes a degree in social work and political science, from Mankato State University, and a masters degree in leadership from Augsburg University. A career path followed that included coordinating programs for elementary school children that promoted reading, coordinating services for survivors of domestic violence, and writing grants to procure support for recruiting and retaining women in non-traditional careers (skilled trades mostly filled by men, paying higher wages than traditional women's careers).


Donna originally attended the monthly bookclub meetings in person. Over time, it became increasingly more difficult due to hearing loss. She continues to participate by writing her book reviews and sending these via email to be shared at the meetings. Her writing skills were noted by all participants and this has led to Donna writing concise descriptions for books chosen for Plymouth Reads and some promotional materials.

Donna has led efforts to improve accessibility for seniors. Macular degeneration, a leading cause of vision loss in senior adults, is a condition Donna made the Plymouth Reads Planning Committee aware of. She has advocated for more large print editions of books to be available for our senior community. This has promoted outreach to the Lions Club in Plymouth, who responded with a generous donation to purchase these books. Donna is the "self-appointed" liaison between many of the senior living communities in Plymouth and the Plymouth Reads program. She takes a large print copy of the book selected, a sign up sheet for a turn at reading the book, and a poster announcing the events associated with he book.

Transportation issues are another challenge seniors face. Many events are held in the evening and many seniors do not drive at night. Donna has requested that Zoom options be added to the author talks whenever possible, as use of technology allows seniors to participate.


Donna has said that her life has focused on providing others with access to information and ideas. She continues to do just that and we are so grateful she does.
