# Financial Update for September 2025





So far this year, we've had four book sales that brought in a total of \$27,620 (\$7,660 in January, \$7,390 in March, \$5,520 in May, and \$7,050 in July). July was the first sale where we offered Venmo as an optional payment method. Of the \$7,050 total sale proceeds, \$1,157 came through Venmo. Venmo payments go directly to the Friends of Hennepin County Library (FHCL). This payment option was well received by our customers. In addition, Venmo makes funds available more quickly to the FHCL and saves the local Friends in time spent processing payments from the sale.


During these seven months, we also received \$4,200 in donations from the Ready Reads carts of used books in the library lobby, and \$1,310 from memberships. As was noted in past Newsletters, we have transferred our membership process to the FHCL. This change means that the amount reported here for memberships will be our total for the year. Money received for dues is now going directly to the FHCL and will continue to be used for the benefit of Hennepin County libraries.

From this year's income, we've sent four grants totaling \$25,900 to the FHCL. The first was for \$7,000 designated to be used for the World Class Collection, the second was for \$7,400 to support the Outreach and Engagement initiative, the third for \$6,000 supports Student Success, specifically the "Let's Read" and "Homework Help" programs, and the fourth for \$5,500 was for Youth Development. In addition, we designated the \$1,157 Venmo payments for Youth Development.

The financial support we are able to provide to the FHCL for the benefit of all 41 libraries is made possible by of all the enthusiastic shoppers at our book sales. We have *two* more sales this year. Hope to see you there!



# Save the Date: MALF's "Saturday Splash" Scheduled for Saturday, October 11



The Minnesota Association of Library Friends, which includes the Friends of the Plymouth Library as a member, is excited to announce the return of their popular Friends of the Library mini-conference for 2025.

MALF will convene Friends from across Minnesota online for the fifth annual Saturday Splash on **Saturday, October 11, from 10 AM – 12 PM.** Full itinerary will be released later this summer, but they have announced their keynote author and emcee: **award-winning author Cary J. Griffith.** 

Cary J. Griffith is best known for his compelling narratives that delve into the natural world, both through nonfiction and in the form of popular, propulsive fiction. As an author, Griffith routinely presents at libraries across Minnesota and the Upper Midwest.

"Over the last year alone I have spoken at more than 50 public libraries," he estimates. "When visiting, I am reminded again and again about how great it is to be a Minnesotan, where we support and fund our public libraries so they can continue to evolve to address the needs of the communities they serve."

Griffith recognizes that grassroots Friends of the Library groups are an important part of that equation.


# Try Ukulele



Dedicated to the unique needs of an adult population, the Adult Learning Center offers a comprehensive and integrated suite of services, including the GED prep, 24/7 Writing Lab, Live Tutoring, Skills Building, Career Resources, U.S. Citizenship Prep, Microsoft Office Essentials, and 24/7 Question Center.

Live Tutoring allows learners the option to use our cutting-edge whiteboard technology to ask academic questions while Skills Building provides the opportunity for a structured session that focuses on specific academic skills. Both options utilize our field-tested database of lesson modules (including adult appropriate reading passages, supplemental exercises, and simulated test questions) to help

users master key concepts. With Skills Building, sessions run more sequentially, and users often work through topics systematically.

The Adult Learning Center also offers two types of writing assistance for business and personal needs: live assistance from expert writing tutors and the 24/7 Writing Lab. Our 24/7 Writing Lab is ideal when an extended analysis is required, and the writing is more than 1-2 pages.
